19th Shangri-La Dialogue

The 19th Shangri-La Dialogue - Asia's premier defence summit - was hosted from June 10 to June 12, 2022, in Singapore after a two-year break due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This annual security dialogue is organised by the London-based International Institute for Strategic Studies. The dialogue saw participation of diplomats, officials and defence experts from across Asia. Japanese Prime Minister, Fumio Kishida delivered the keynote address to open the summit, where the region's most pressing strategic and economic challenges were discussed.
