## **Tension intensifies in the Taiwan Strait**

Post Xi's warning of 'playing with fire', the visit of US House Speaker Nancy Pelosi to Taiwan, the highest-ranking US elected official to visit Taipei since 1997 brewed up tensions in the Indo-Pacific. The standoff between the US and China over Taiwan has thrown a spotlight on growing risks to one of the world's busiest shipping lanes. Taiwan fears its security and sovereignty, Pelosi's visit which focussed on three issues human rights, trade and security seen by China as a challenge to its 'One China Policy'.
