## 'India-Japan 2+2 Ministerial Meeting in Tokyo'

This year marks 70 years of diplomatic relations between the two peace-promoting nations. The second India-Japan 2+2 Foreign and Defence Ministerial Meeting was held in Tokyo on September 08, 2022. The Ministers offered to further strengthen the Special Strategic and Global Partnership which was first emphasised during the first 2+2 meet held in New Delhi in 2019. The Ministers reaffirmed their commitment to a rules-based international order that respects the sovereign and territorial integrity of nations. The meeting also discussed measures toward enhancing greater bilateral cooperation in security and defence.
