## G20 Bali Summit: Recover Together, Recover Stronger

The seventeenth meeting of the Group of Twenty (G20) nations was held in Nusa Dua, Bali, Indonesia on 15-16 November 2022. G20 leaders met for a two-day pinnacle summit hosted by the Indonesian G20 presidency under the theme, 'Recover Together, Recover Stronger'. The group was formed in 1999 for resolving the global economic and financial crisis that had engulfed the world during the last decade of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. The summit saw extensive discussions on the revival of the global economy, food security, climate change and condemnation of Russian aggression among other high-priority agendas.
