## **India-Japan Bilateral Relation**

04 March – 05 April, 2022

The India-Japan bilateral relationship has recently been under the spotlight. The 14th India-Japan Annual Summit took place at a significant time as the two countries were celebrating the 70th anniversary of establishment of diplomatic relations. Reaffirming the Special Strategic and Global Partnership between the two, Japan has offered to invest US\$42 billion in India over a period of five years. This would be in the areas of health and medical care, electrical vehicles, power and energy, urban environment management, agriculture and rural development among others.
